

- Commit to participate and capitalize on the educational opportunities provided at school.



- If a student or a teacher borrows any book from the library, he/ she is responsible to return it back in due time and in a good condition.
- The student and his guardian will sign a conditioned paper forcing the student to shoulder the responsibility of any damage he causesat school (ex. books, computers, seat)
- The students are not allowed to leave the school campus between arrival time and dismissal time without authorization of the school authorities unless the students are on an approved field trip or otherschool activity.

School's Policy:

Admission Policy:

Upon enrollment, we ask students to list previous educational training and any high school courses they've already taken. Appropriate credit may be given depending on the relevance of the courses, when they were taken, and the student's proficiency in the subjects, as demonstrated by official transcripts. Students applying to **Sunrise Language School** must present previous school records, and have an interview with the principal. Once an evaluation has been made, the applicant will be placed in the proper gradelevel.

Admission from Egyptian and Language Schools

All students must provide official exam results. Students who have successfully completed 3rd prep (grade 9) will be considered for admission for grade 10.



Admission procedures

New students seeking enrollment must submit the following documents to the Registrar's office:

1- 6 photos.

2- Birth certificate.

3- All the educational certificates the student had achieved.4- An application to join the division.

5- Interviewing the students and his parents.

6- Assessment exam in English and

Math.7- ID cards of the parents.

8- Copy of passport (Non-Egyptians)

Attendance Policy

Attendance is the first step in ensuring academic achievement. Scholars must show up and give their best effort at school each and every day, Regular attendance is required.

- Sunrise Language School operates from 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., Sunday through Thursday.
- We also are available on Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. to all students in case they need extra support or any inquiry.
- All absences "Excused" and "Unexcused"- are considered absences: Any day your child does not attend school is considered an absence. Only scholar illness (with doctor's note), a death in the family, religious holiday (with parent/guardian notes) are considered 'excused' absences, though the scholar is still considered (and marked) absent from school.

Tardiness Policy

Punctuality is an important factor in achieving success in business and education. If a student is more than 15 minutes late, he/ she must obtain the instructor's permission before entering the class. Six (6) unexcused incidents of tardiness constitute only one (1) absence. The first tardy of the term will be a warning.

Bullying Policy

Never in the history of education has it been as important as it is today to have an effective bullying policy. Students across the globe are affected by bullying every single day. The number of bullying incidents only continues to increase each year. We hear about students dropping out of school or taking their lives because of bullying all too often. Schools have to make bullying prevention and bullying education a top priority.

Bullying means an international electronic, written, verbal, or physical act or series of acts directed at another student or students, which occursin a school setting and/or outside a school setting, that is severe, persistent or pervasive and has the effect of doing any of the following:

- 1. Substantial interference with a student's education.
- 2. Creation of a threatening environment.
- 3. Substantial disruption of the orderly operation of the school.

The Board prohibits all forms of bullying by district students or he/she will be subjected to the following penalties:

- > 1st offence: oral warning.
- $> 2^{nd}$ offence: written note to the parent.
- > 3^{rd} offence: suspension up to 5 days and parent conference with the principle.

- Work missed due to absence under the absence policy must be made up within the time allowed.
- All teachers take into consideration incorrect spelling, incorrect grammar, and incorrect punctuation, lack of capitalization, incomplete sentences, and illegible writing in <u>All</u> written work
- Final examinations will be given in all subjects at the end of each semester at the scheduled time. Such examinations are part of the course requirements.
- A parent may pick up his child's report card at the end of each Quarter.
- If a student is failing or in danger of failing (D, F or an I [incomplete]) the parent will be contacted by the Administration.

Summer School and Retention Policies

Summer school may be recommended or required for school students. If a child is recommended, summer school is not a requirement to move to the next grade level. If summer school is required, passing summer school successfully is a condition to move to the next grade level.

Criteria for failing/passing a course: If a School student fails the first semester of a core subject course, the student must earn a grade percentage high enough during the second semester of that course, that when both semester grades are added together and divided by two, the overall percentage is 60% or higher. However, if a student passes the first semester and fails the second semester of a core subject course, the student will not pass and will be required to attend summer school.

Summer School Option

If failing 1 or 2 core subjects (Math, English, Science and Social Studies), the student is required to attend and pass the school approved, summer school program in order to pass on to next grade level.

Repeating the Grade

If at the end of the academic year a student fails 3 or more of the yearlong core courses (Math, English, Science and Social Studies), the student is required to repeat the current grade. Attending summer school will not allow the student to move to the next grade level. Final decisions will be made by the School Administration.

Cheating:

A student who cheats will be subjected to the following penalties:

- 1) 1st offence in a class: Warring
- 2) 2nd offence in a class: detention



3) 3rd offence in a class; Extra work

4) 4th offence in a class: Denial of readmission to sunrise School

Alcohol and Drugs:

Possession / Use or Under Influence / Selling

1st offence: Up to a (5) day suspension and parent conference with the principal.

2nd offence: Up to a (10) day suspension and parent conference with the principal.

3rd offence: Denial of re-admission to Sunrise Language School.

<u>Assault:</u>

Physical or Verbal or Written assault by a student upon any other student which occurs on or near school property, or at any school sponsored activity or in any school vehicle will be dealt with strictly and immediately by the School Administration according to the evaluation of the Principal.

<u>N.B:</u>

- > Acts of Student Misconduct Range of Disciplinary Action in general:
- Conference with student
- Problem solving meeting and behavior plan, including before and after school detention.
- A student who is on suspension is not allowed on School Grounds or at School Activities for any reason unless authorized by an administrator



Dress Code:

- Students are required to follow Sunrise Language School uniform dress code.
- We ask that all scholars come to school in clean, neat uniforms every day. Scholars may not change out of their uniform dress code at any point during the school day or any school field trips.
- The Uniform is available at the school.

Behavior:


STANDARDS OF STUDENT BEHAVIOR

- Appropriate behavior reflects the person's commitment to courtesy, thoughtfulness of others and respecting the rights of other people. Students are expected to behave themselves as good citizens at school.
- Students are responsible for knowing and obeying all school rules and regulations.
- Every student is expected to be on time to school, to attend all classes, to behave in a proper manner, adopting good study habits and abstaining from using vulgar or profane language.
- Students are expected to comply with all reasonable requests from staff members.
- Students are expected to conduct themselves in a manner respectful to the school, home, family and community. Horseplay is dangerous and will not be tolerated.
- Students are expected to resolve conflicts or personal problems in a socially acceptable manner with the help of principle, social workers, or other members of school related organizations.



- Clothing and accessories that are considered distracting to the instructional program are unacceptable.
- Young women are to dress appropriately without exposing themselves; wearing shorts or dresses that are obviously too short is unacceptable. Undergarments are not to be exposed.
- Clothing is to be neat and clean.
- The School Administration doesn't accept any violation of the approved community standards. Fighting, shoving, and assault are unacceptable at all.
- Display of public affection to a member of the opposite sex is unacceptable.
- Acting in a disrespectful manner towards any staff member is totally unacceptable.
- All forms of Cheating are forbidden {copying another student's paper, writing answers on Clothes and desks and in calculator memory, looking at another student's test, having the work done by someone else, talking or signaling with hands during a test, having cheat sheets.}
- Smoking and the use or possession of tobacco in any form is prohibited.
- Possession of any kind of weapons is not allowed at school.
 {Firearm, dagger dirk, knife, fireworks}

In case of any violation of the above-mentioned approved community standards, the School Administration has the right to take strict measures which include (but not limited to) the following





Map Testing:

In order to assess students` performance and derive trusted data to

guide instruction, SLS applies MAP tests in English and Math for

Grades1-8. The MAP test will be applied twice a year.

MEALS

- Families may send lunch to school; however, scholars will not have access to a refrigerator or microwave.
- If sending lunch to school with your child, we ask that you send in nutritious foods. Please do not let your child bring unhealthy drinks(e.g., colas or juices heavy in sugar) or unhealthy foods to school.

Library / Media Center:

The library is a large room shared by a number of students, teachers, and staff. It serves as both a reading and information center within the context of the various curricula taught in all divisions of our school. In addition to books, the library subscribes to many newspapersand magazines in both English and Arabic.

In order that everyone may enjoy and make use of the library, library users must be respectful and share:

* The materials and resources, by returning them on time for someone else to borrow, by putting them where they belong, by keeping them ingood condition, and by taking turns.

* The space by allowing others to use the facilities.

- * The sound space, by not interfering with someone else's need to read, to find information, or to study.
- * Reasonable care must be taken to maintain the book in good condition.Students will be charged for lost or damaged materials. The librarians are here to help you! Please enjoy!



Technical services

-Computer labs.

-A computer in each class.

-Two servers that are used to distribute the internet connection.

- Eight wireless router.

-Staff is provided with laptops to help them achieve their tasks faster.

-The school offers a Lase Line, internet accelerator connected with DSL, File Server, and mail servers.

-Current internet connections are 14MB / s along with IP's for the servers.

-Computers that are in the computer lab have internet access where student can make the best use out of these technological means.

- The school acquires scanners players, CD burners, loud speakers, microphones, USB flash memory sticks.

- The school uses biometric time attendance machine that uses the fingerprint.

- Using web filters to prevent viewing any illegal sites.

- Using fire-wall to prevent internal and external attacks.

-Providing classes with projectors and smart boards.

-There are qualified persons who help both teachers and students in computer programs difficulties, internet connectivity problems if found, and any other problem that could face either teachers or students.

-The help desk also offers Technical support, website, navigational assistance; installation, setup, and repair problems; training for software,hardware and internet.

- Educators and technology support specialist will meet periodically to evaluate emerging software and hardware.



Lost and Found:

A Lost and Found area is maintained on campus. Any student property found on campus or on buses is turned in to the Lost and Found. To minimize loss, all items of clothing, school supplies, personal items, etc., should be labeled with the student's name. When students lose something, they should check with security at the Lost and Found. Valuable items such as a phone, smartwatch, camera, jewelry and large amounts of money should not be brought to school.

Health Services:

Medical doctors who are trained and experienced in handling student health conditions are on duty each school day. If a student becomes ill during school, they should request a pass from their teacher to go to the doctor. If the student needs to leave school because of illness, the parent/guardian must be notified and give consent and the student must sign out in the MS office. The doctors are available to counsel students regarding health problems, to help manage health factors for individual students, and to administer first aid in case of emergency.



Transportation:

Sunrise Language School offers bus transportation for students whose parent's contract for these services. Within certain restrictions, busing is provided door to door. This service is available to those students who pay for bus service.

Students are responsible for following and obeying the bus rules and regulations. In the event a student violates the established rules, he/she is subject to disciplinary action. In more severe cases, a student may be suspended from riding; at first, temporarily, and if necessary, permanently.

If the bus driver is distracted by student's behavior, he cannot pay strict attention to his driving. This poses a safety problem for all students on the bus. All bus rules apply on field trips as well as for daily transportation.

1. Students must adhere to the direction of the bus monitor.

- 2. Students are to use the established pick-up points only.
- 3. Students are required to stay in their seats.

4. Students are to refrain from protruding their head, hands, and other

object.

5. Students must converse in a quiet voice.

6. Students will be suspended from the bus for physical assault, verbal assault, or inappropriate language directed at another person on the bus.



7. Students will lose any privilege to eat on the bus, if they don't throw their trash away, or are unable to manage their food. This may cause restrictions for the entire bus.

8. Any potentially dangerous objects that need to be brought to school for a project (i.e. glass, knives, swords, etc.) are to be given to the bus monitor.

9. Riders are permitted to get off the bus only at their assigned stops.

10.Buses will not wait at the designed stops in the morning for tardy students.

Student Council

The School Student Council develops student leadership, helps students learn and apply democratic decision-making principles and procedures, and enables students the opportunity to provide service to the school, faculty and student body. Student officers and representatives for the Council are elected each year.

Contact Procedures:

- The Parent must make an appointment first before meeting the Administration.
- The parent can make online contact through our Facebook Group Sunrise American School.

Parent's Reporting Actions:

- The Parent reports the problem to the administration officially.
- The administration investigates the problem and takes the corrective action.
- The parent will be informed by the administration action.
- The action report will be attached to the student file.

Teacher's Reporting Actions:

- The teacher reports the problem to the administration officially.
- The administration will investigate the problem and take the corrective action.
- The teacher will be informed by the administration action.
- The action report will be attached to the student file or the teacher's file.
- The parent will be informed of-the problem and the corrective action.



Graduation Requirements:

- Students are required to take eight (8) subjects each academic year.
- Students are required to earn 24 credits with passing grades.
- Students are required to be in attendance for at least 85% of school days.
- Students are required to meet minimum university eligibility requirements on the SAT I and SAT II according to university choices.

Public universities: (SAT I a minimum of 1060 out of 1600) (SAT II 1100 out of 1600)

Private universities: (SAT | 890/1600) (SAT || 1000)

SAT Exams are held 6 times a year. The student has the right to be re-examined at every time to achieve high scores. (Exam fees must be paid and an application must be filled at Amid-East each time)
